Prof. Max Abrahms



Max Abrahms is a Professor of public policy in the department of political science at Northeastern University. He is also a Member of the Council on Foreign Relations.

He researches and teaches on asymmetric conflict and international relations theory. His work on asymmetric conflict focuses on the study of civil war, insurgency, nonviolent protest, and terrorism. He is a frequent terrorism analyst in the media, especially on the consequences of terrorism, its motives, and the implications for counterterrorism strategy. His work in international relations theory focuses on the concepts of coercion, perception, misperception, rationality, and signaling in the international system.

He received his Ph.D. from UCLA and has held fellowships at the Center for International Security and Cooperation at Stanford University, the Empirical Studies of Conflict project at Princeton University, the Dickey Center for International Understanding at Dartmouth College, the Political Science department at Johns Hopkins University, and the Combating Terrorism Center at West Point military academy.

Mr Abrahms is a frequent terrorism analyst on Al Jazeera America, BBC, and many other international news outlets.
